YCU is now calling for applications. Throughout their stay in Yokohama, we will help them learning about the experience of Japanese cities, including how they tackled the challenges confronted during the period of economic growth. The applicants will be selected by YCU's Committee based on their research proposal.

Attachment 1: Yokohama Urban Solutions Study (YUSS) Program General Information

1. Background

Most Southeast Asian countries are enjoying industrial expansion and economic growth, improving the lives of millions. However, these economic changes often result in a variety of environmental problems due to lack of adequate infrastructure and institutions. The supply of safe water, waste water treatment, transportation networks, and solid waste management are key elements to support this economic development.

Yokohama City has been aware of these problems as it had to solve them in the past when the city was facing a similar situation during the post-war economic boom after 1960s. Yokohama City has accumulated experience of urban management and has learned to develop partnerships with key stakeholders from citizens, land owners and private businesses to the central government. The city has implemented various projects that have made the city safer, more dynamic, and more sustainable.

These projects include environmental infrastructures for water and solid waste, and urban development projects in transport, reform of hospital systems, improvement of health and welfare, medical system, etc. Especially in public health field, we are in the era of longevity (aging-society), and Yokohama has long experienced aging problems and is struggling to make society better by transforming social system and improving people's quality of life (QOL).

As an educational institution founded by Yokohama City, YCU is in full cooperation with the City to provide YUSS Research Students with opportunities to interview people, make field visits and obtain information and materials needed for your study.

2. Concept of the Yokohama Urban Solutions Study (YUSS) Program

YCU implemented the first Yokohama Urban Solutions Study (YUSS) Program from October to December 2016, for 6 graduate students and young researchers from Vietnam and Malaysia. They came to Yokohama and studied about the measures that Yokohama has taken to cope with its urban challenges.

The Program included class lectures and on-site fieldworks under the supervision of YCU faculty. YUSS intends to provide researchers with the knowledge needed to adapt these urban solutions to rapidly growing cities of Southeast Asia, thereby making them the active and innovative leaders for the 21st century.

In 2017, the second years YUSS Program was conducted with graduate students from University of the Philippines(UP Manila, UP Los Banos), Universiti Sains Malaysia and Hasanuddin University.

This time, YCU is calling for applicants for the third year to invite YUSS students from Asia, Canada and the Czech Republic.
